**ALLOWABLE EXPERIENCE:**

1. One year of substitute experience will be allowed for each year of full-time teaching experience in an approved school per 702 KAR 3:070.
2. One year of substitute experience will be allowed for each year of substitute teaching of forty (40) days or more in the Woodford County School System.

**PROCEDURE FOR LONG-TERM ASSIGNMENTS:**

Whenever a substitute teacher assignment exceeds twenty (20) days, the substitute will be paid from regular certified salary schedule. This rate of pay will begin on the twenty-first (21st) day. To be eligible for this procedure, the service must be continuous within the same position, and the substitute must hold proper certification for the teaching assignment.

**CLASSIFIED SUBSTITUTES**

Classified substitutes will start at zero years' experience and will not earn years' experience on the salary schedule while substituting in a classified capacity. If an employee has previously worked in Woodford County Public Schools in a classified contract position and earned years of experience on the salary schedule and returns at a later date as a classified substitute, they will be paid based upon prior years of verifiable classified experience. It is the employees responsibility to provide information regarding when they were previously employed.
